The Apostles' Creed

Like Saint Valentine, who risked his life to help people love each other,

we adore you, God, for loving us.

Like Saint Zita, whose cleaning and cooking were always full of praise to you,

we thank you, God, for meeting our everyday needs.

Like Saint Joseph, who loved your son, Jesus, as if he was his own,

we thank you, God, for our families.

Like Saint John, who knew how much you loved him,

we thank you, God, for friendship.

Like Saint Kateri, who saw every tree as a symbol of your love, and taught us to protect them,

we thank you, God, for teaching us to care for creation.

Like Saint Maria Gabriella, who spent her last days praying that the Church would no longer be divided, we ask you, God, to bring us together.

Like Saint Marguerite, who taught people no one else would teach, and Saint Thomas, who struggled as a student, we ask you, God, to help us teach and learn the truth.

Like Saint Francis, who gave up everything to spend time loving even the smallest plants and animals,

we ask you, God, to show us how to love creation.

Like Saint Medard, who was sheltered from storms and went on to shelter others,

we ask you, God, to protect those in danger from the weather.

Like Saint Dymphna, who struggled with sadness, and Saint Peregrine, who was miraculously healed, and Saint Maximillian, who overcame addiction, and Saint Lidwina, who praised you in spite of lifelong pain,

we ask you, God, to heal and comfort those in sickness or pain.

God, thank you for giving us examples of love, bravery, and joy throughout history. With all the saints who we know, and those who we don't, we, who are also your saints, adore you for yourself, thank you for your gifts, and ask you for your help, through your son and our best example, Jesus Christ.

Do this to remember me.

Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

Father, as we bring this bread and wine, and remember his death and resurrection, send your Holy Spirit, that we who share these gifts may be fed by Christ's body and his blood. Pour your Spirit on us that we may love one another, work for the healing of the earth, and share the good news of Jesus, as we wait for his coming in glory. For honour and praise belong to you, Father, with Jesus your Son, and the Holy Spirit: one God, for ever and ever.
