Now who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good? But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defence to anyone who demands from you an account of the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and reverence. Keep your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who abuse you for your good conduct in Christ may be put to shame. For it is better to suffer for doing good, if suffering should be God's will, than to suffer for doing evil. For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight people, were saved through water. And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you—not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him. 1 Peter 3:13-22

Confirmation

For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. Presentation & Examination

The presenters say to the bishop I present Daniel Justin Livio Hodge-Masnaghetti for confirmation.

The bishop asks Daniel to renew his baptismal commitment

Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil? *Daniel responds:* I do.

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support Daniel in his life in Christ? We will.

Baptismal Covenant

Let us join with those who commit themselves again to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit? I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers? **I will, with God's help.**

Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord? I will, with God's help.

Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ? I will, with God's help.

Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?

I will, with God's help.

Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

I will, with God's help.

Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation, and respect, sustain and renew the life of the Earth?

I will, with God's help.

Lord, hear our prayer.

Into your hands, O Lord, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your mercy, through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Almighty God, we thank you that by the death and resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ you have overcome sin and brought us to yourself, and that by the sealing of your Holy Spirit you have bound us to your service. Renew in these your servants the covenant you made with them at their baptism. Send them forth in the power of that Spirit to perform the service you set before them; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

For you, the heavenly one, make all things new; you are the beginning and the end, the last and the first.

Praise, glory and love be yours, this and every day, from us and all people, here and everywhere. Amen.

A Brief History: 1873-2023

In April 1873, the Cote St. Antoine mission of St. George's Church held its first service in the small front room of a member of the church's Young Men's Christian Association. In the 150 years that have followed, St. Matthias', as the mission became known, has been many different shapes and sizes, but it has always been a place that many, many people could call home.

Today, in a building built between 1910 and 1913, on land gifted to the church in 1875, our congregation steps into the next 150 years with a strong sense of who we are and where we are called to go. What does a 150-year-old congregation look like?

We worship with a vibrant diversity of ancient and contemporary liturgies, enhanced by carefully chosen and beautifully led music and offering both in-person and remote participation options. We devote nearly 2500 volunteer hours each year to preparing for, leading, welcoming into, and cleaning up from worship!

Our community outreach follows Christ's example in considering the needs of the communities in which we find ourselves, giving of our time, our resources, and the many talents of our parishioners; we support 9 community organisations directly, make our space available to community groups, and host the oldest Meals on Wheels program in Quebec.

Fellowship is an important part of our life together, and we take great pride in welcoming all to socialise, share, and grow in community with each other. Whether in weekly coffee hours, summertime pub theology, or special events in the life of the church, Matthians love to enjoy each other's company!

All members of St. Matthias' have the opportunity to participate in Christian education; whether in the Sunday School or in special study series throughout the year, we believe that growing into deeper knowledge of our faith and our tradition is part of our identity. Our quarterly family services provide opportunities for all members of St. Matthias', regardless of age, to come together in worship.

We also take great care to do our best to beautify our spaces, maintain and support our aging infrastructure, and to care for even the smallest parts of our home, from kneelers to candle holders. Working together is one of the ways we offer worship to God and care to each other. In an average year, St. Matthias' sees almost 150 volunteers give over 6,000 hours; hears 80 anthems and motets offered by our choir; and consumes 200 cobs of corn, 1500 communion wafers, and countless cups of coffee and tea.

Thank you for joining us as we celebrate where we have been, who we are now, and what God is calling us to become.
